HOME SAFETY ASSESSMENT

What to Look For

a. Check for things that might cause falls.

b.Find places where extra support could help in daily tasks.

• Useful Checklists

- Use the "Aging Adults Safety Checklist" from the National Council for Aging for a general check.
- For fall risks, use the "Fall Prevention Checklist" from Tompkins County Office of Aging.

• Getting Professional Advice

- Professionals like certified aging-in-place specialists (CAPS) can give advice.
- Places like Tompkins County Aging Office, Finger Lakes Independence Center, Gerould's Healthcare, and Lowe's Livable Home Services offer free advice.
- Contact them to plan a visit or find more services nearby.

EQUIPMENT (LOAN/RENT/PURCHASE)

Borrow for Short-Term Needs

- Use the FLIC loan closet for quick needs, testing, or temporary changes in your home.
- Items like wheelchairs, ramps, and shower chairs are available.
- You can also borrow devices for vision, hearing, and mobility issues.

Buying Equipment

- Select professional home improvement retailers, and ask if shipping and installation service is available.
- Shop in-store or online. Call or visit to compare options.

Need help or have questions? Call the provider or contact COFA for guidance.

CONTRACTORS

• Certified Specialists

- Choose Certified Aging-In-Place Specialists (CAPS).
- Local options: Dean Shea, Gary Slade, Charles Freiberger.

• Ask for Recommendations

• Get names from people who had a good experience.

Before Hiring

- Compare different contractors.
- Check their references and insurance.
- Get a written agreement.
- Don't pay everything upfront.

- INHS offers:
- Major Repair: For big projects like roofing and energy improvements.
- Minor Repair: For smaller fixes, like handrails and leaky faucets.
 - FLIC installs temporary ramps.

Government Subsidies

• Check COFA's recent Benefit Checklist for available subsidies in Tompkins County.

Extra Options

• School Tax Relief (STAR) program offers property tax relief in New York State.

• For changes to systems like electrical, plumbing, heating.

- Each local government has a process:
 - In Ithaca, use the Town of Ithaca Open.gov portal.
 - Instructions are on their building permit application webpage.
 - Check Section 125-5 of the Town Code for exempted work.
